Covid Update

We are very glad that the province of Ontario is easing Covid restrictions. As of March 1, 2022 capacity limits have been lifted in all indoor public settings

- proof of vaccination requirements have been lifted although some businesses and organizations may choose to require proof of vaccination upon entry. Restaurants and cinemas and shops are open at full capacity.
- other protective measures, such as mask/face covering requirements and passive screening of patrons remain in place; further updates are expected at the end of March.
- SOC assists all students who aren't fully vaccinated against Covid to complete their vaccinations.

Student Health and Wellbeing

Euclid Math Test

Registration for the University of Waterloo's Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing's EUCLID TEST closes **March 11**. The Euclid Test itself will be written on **April 5** for students in Canada and **April 6** for others. Written by over 19,000 students worldwide every year, the Euclid Contest gives grade 12 students the opportunity to tackle novel problems with creativity and knowledge they've gained in secondary-school mathematics. The contest's mix of short-answer and full-solution questions challenges students to practice communicating their thinking and helps learners build perseverance, a crucial component of mathematical problem-solving.

Students who are planning to study engineering, computer science and mathematics, especially at the University of Waterloo, should consider taking part in the Euclid, as should those who are applying for scholarships. This is a great opportunity to shine!

Semester 3 begins on April 19, 2022 and runs to June 30. Watch this space for the date for graduation in late June.
