Students are given the chance to perfect their English and learn about Canadian culture within and outside the classroom.



The **English Program** is a comprehensive course aimed at students who want to develop their English abilities in a focused academic environment. Daily classes are led by experienced teachers who will develop all aspects of the students' English abilities.

The **morning classes** concentrate on improving the students' pronunciation, speaking, listening, and conversational skills through a variety of communicative activities.

The **afternoon classes** present students with a chance to learn about historic Canadian landmarks they will get to visit through the course of the Summer Program. A few areas of study are Canadian Geography, Science, System of Government to name a few. Places of Interest



1. Niagara falls

The Canadian sections of the Niagara Falls is the largest of the three falls that make up the whole. Besides its name as the Canadian Falls, it is known as the Horseshoe Falls and it straddles the international border of the United States (New York State) and Ontario Canada. Horseshoe falls ranks as the most powerful waterfall in North America measured by flow rate.



2. CN Tower

The Canadian National (CN) tower named after the company that built it in 1976 was the world's tallest free-standing structure from 1975 to 2007 (553m) and remains an attraction for millions of visitors annually. The variety of observation decks, entertainment complex and revolving restaurant provide some of the many activities available to engage in.



Ripley's Aquarium of Canada

Toronto's fantastic underwater experience for young children and adults alike is a must see. Boasting over 15,000 aquatic animals, 5.7 million liters of marine and fresh water from around the world, there is no shortage of things to behold. The animal experts educate and entertain, supervising hands on experiences through touch tanks and educational dive presentations.



4. Canada's Wonderland

Established in 1981, Canada's Wonderland is still the premier destination for amusement park thrills, rollercoasters, a breath-taking water park, and over 200 other wonderous attractions. 2023 introduces Snoopy's Racing Railway as well as the world's only 360—degree spinning swing ride.





5. Royal Ontario Museum

Founded in 2014, the Royal Ontario Museum is home to over 13 million world-class artworks, cultural objects, and natural history specimen. The amalgamation of the original architecture with the contemporary Michael Lee-Chin Crystal design by Daniel Libeskind provides a national landmark and dynamic cultural experience.





6. Toronto Zoo

The largest zoo in Canada with 5,000 animals representing 500 species, it has one of the most taxonomically diverse collection of animals on display of any zoo worldwide. Amongst the seven zoogeographic regions to choose from

attendees can see animals from Africa, Eurasia, Indo-Malaya, Tundra Trek in addition to the waterside theatre and Kids zoo.



7. Royal Botanical Gardens

Northwest of Hamilton sits
Canada's largest botanical
garden comprised of
an extensive variety of
environmental protection
areas, historic sites and is one
of the major tourist attractions
between Niagara Falls and
Toronto. The garden spans
an area of 10 km by 4 km
comprising of over a thousand
hectares of trees, flowers



and plants, including numerous rare species. There's also a rock garden, an arboretum and a wildlife sanctuary with trails traversing wetlands and wooded ravines. From June to October, thousands of delicate jewels bloom in the Centennial Rose Garden, and in spring over 125,000 flowering bulbs awaken in an explosion of color.

8. University of Toronto

Consistently ranked as the best in Canada and one of the best Universities in the world, the University of Toronto is a hub for innovation, creative solutions, and exploration. An institution with a campaign like "Defy Gravity" let's you know that breaking barriers and uncovering new ground is not the exception but the rule.





9. McMaster University





McMaster University is a public research university in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. In 2021, McMaster ranked #1 for graduate research funding and #2 in faculty research funding. With a total sponsored research income of \$353.5 million, McMaster research teams are making discoveries and advancing knowledge in every discipline.
